Notes re the St Philips registers:

Church Registers

The entries from the church registers themselves were used for BDA's transcriptions of baptisms, marriages and burials.

As copies of the pre-1826 St Philips registers are found in the State Records of New South Wales' Archives Kit (ARK) which is available in many local libraries, we have provided ARK as the primary source for these early entries to enable easy access for users. It is worth noting that all entries from 1787 to 1856 (and onwards) are also found in the Society of Australian Genealogists' microfilms 90 and 91 (held by SAG and ML). The duplication/cross-over in dates for the pre-1825 period is due to the entries being listed in different sections based upon status (free/convict, married/single, etc.)

Clergy Returns

These are copies of the church registers sent to the government (similarly to the Bishop's Transcripts in England), and begin in 1811.

For the period from 1811 to 1825, the Clergy Returns were documented differently to the church registers. They were produced quarterly rather than being divided into sections like the St Philips registers. All quarters have survived from January 1811 until December 1825 except for April-June 1813. Churchings are also found in these quarterly returns for the period from Jan 1811 to March 1813.

These early Clergy Returns sometimes included additional information which will be incorporated into BDA's transcription to generate more detailed composite entries. When such information is added, the source-reference for the Clergy Returns will be added to BDA's transcription.

For the period from 1826 onwards, the Clergy Returns were identical to the Church Registers. Accordingly, the Clergy Returns were examined only if specific entries were difficult to read in the original registers.

Colonial Office Clergy Returns

Copies of the Clergy Returns were sent back to Britain among the Governor's Despatches and are found within the Colonial Office records held by The National Archives, Kew, London. BDA staff are examining the microfilms of these despatches and copying useful lists for inclusion in BDA, so these will be added to the above lists when located.

The Colonial Office versions of the Clergy Returns are duplicates and will only be used if the SRNSW version is missing or unreadable.

Kerrison James Index

This index was not used as a transcription source for these BDA entries as it is merely an index extracted from the registers and contains many errors. Sometimes, however, the Kerrison James list was examined if specific entries were difficult to read in the pre-1826 period.

Churchings

Churchings were ceremonies in which women were blessed after giving birth. The origin of this ceremony appears to lie in the Jewish purification ritual (google Churching of Women for further information). Churching ceremonies were performed even when a child was stillborn, so a reference to a woman in the churching registers without any concomittant baptism or infant burial entry can provide a clue to the existence of another child, or explain a long gap in childbearing.

NSW Registry of Birth, Death & Marriage Indexes

For the pre-1856 period, the online Indexes published by the NSW Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages provides index entries for baptisms, marriages and burials found in registers they hold.

For the pre-1826 period for St Philips, the BDM Indexes users two sources:

- 1. The Church Registers listed above; that is, Volumes 4 to 8 of ARK;
- 2. The Kerrison James listed above; that is Volume 1 of ARK.

For the period from 1826 onwards, the BDM Indexes use the Clergy Returns listed
